Three ways for college students to position themselves to get a job with the government

- **Internships while in School**: Complete an internship, so the agency gets to know you and can possibly offer you a position when you graduate.
- **Upon Graduation**: During your senior year, apply for Federal jobs using the following website, www.studentjobs.gov.
- **While in Graduate School**: During the Spring/Summer of your first year, apply for a position through the Presidential Management Fellows Program.

- Update your resume
 - Hard copy
 - Online at StudentJobs.gov
- Do as many as informational interviews as possible (phone or in person), and at each interview, get the names of two more contacts
- Visit the WVU Career Services Center
